Chief Nursing Officer Christal Burns Care Regional Medical Center said the hospital does see a problem (CRMC) Business Development with heroin overdoses. Those who call Director Randall Freeze provided data 911 are usually taken care of by the time from the records regarding overdoses on they reach the emergency room. EMS officials are able to give the life-saving

"Usually that is the main thing that accidental, there were 19 overdose cases they need and a lot of times one dose is in 2013. There have been 10 overdose enough and sometimes it is not," Burns

Some of these are not admitted to the emergency room.

"The ones that we see are the ones where family or friends put them in their car and bring them up here. We go get them from the car. They will be blue, be not breathing and often appear deceased or almost deceased," she said.

They are brought into the hospital and administered Narcan. The treatment is very quick, but emergency room staff recommends they stay for a while to be monitored and given additional doses if needed. Burns said those brought to the

hospital often sign themselves out once they regain consciousness and feel good, which is often against medical advise.

"What's so sad is that the parents aren't going to know about this. They won't know that their child almost died because most of them are adults, and if they choose to tell them, it's their decision," Burns said.

The hospital not only does not notify parents or guardians, but also does not notify police because of privacy policies.
