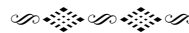

JUNE'S SPOTLIGHT COMPATRIOT


Thank you for the support! I was just selected for the Air Mobility Command's Safety Officer of the Year award. They wanted my bio for their magazine and I've attached it in this e-mail. I am still a Captain, though I will pin on Major next March. I've been at McGuire AFB, NJ for about seven months now and really enjoy it. Of course, NJ does not compare for Charleston or San Antonio—you can't beat the moderate winter climate! Jennifer and I have one daughter, Madison, and another daughter due in June. I'm still flying the C-17 and just upgraded to Evaluator (the highest position possible for an aircrew member). My Squadron (and I) will be deploying to Al Udeid Air Base, Qatar in September for four months. While deployed, we will be providing critical cargo, convoy relief, and aeromedical evacuation in to and out of Iraq and Afghanistan every day.

Medals include: Meritorious Service Medal, Air Medal, Air Force Commendation Medal, Air Force Achievement Medal, Combat Readiness Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Global War On Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, and Humanitarian Service Medal.

The one nice thing about living in NJ is that I am only three hours from D.C. I've been to the DAR library and National Archives once already for research and found several new ancestors who qualify. I can't wait to go back. I wish I could say when I might return to San Antonio. Unfortunately, I just don't know. I am receiving the newsletter thanks to Mr. Harcourt and enjoy the material every month. I hope the Chapter is still strong!

AMC Safety Officer of the Year Award
 Capt Myers S. Gray,
 437 AW, Charleston AFB, SC

Capt Myers S. Gray was the Chief of Wing Flight Safety for the 437th Airlift Wing, Charleston AFB, SC.

As the Chief of Flight Safety, Capt Gray had a significant impact while overseeing the Wing's flight safety program. His contributions included an outstanding rating on AMC's Program Evaluation Visit and the development and implementation of a virtual safety read file providing aircrew members the latest safety information at their fingertips. He investigated and authored 53 reportable mishaps, identifying critical engine malfunctions, noncompliant cargo and shipping procedures, and aircraft flight control issues.

Capt Gray worked with C-17 simulator instructors at Charleston to incorporate "lessons learned" into flight training programs. He briefed 500+ military and civilian aviators on midair collision avoidance, and worked on multiple occasions with squadron commanders to deliver a personal safety message to everyone leaving the base on long holiday weekends.

Capt Gray was raised in Austin, TX, commissioned through Texas Christian University ROTC in 1998, and attended pilot training at Laughlin AFB, TX. Other assignments included Randolph AFB as a C-21 Instructor Pilot and Charleston AFB as a C-17 Instructor Pilot. He is currently a C-17 Instructor Pilot with the 6th Airlift Squadron at McGuire AFB.
