Accomplishments

- Devoted 4-6 hours, 4 times a week to staff the Sexual Minority Youth Assistance League (S.M.Y.A.L.) phone help line, which helped questioning youth who called in on a wide-range of topics.
- Drafted, and the D.C. City Council passed, two pieces of legislation for the GLBT community. The first law allowed domestic partners to have a say in their partner's burial desires if no will is left. Second law allowed independent health organizations administer the city's needle exchange program. In the past, it was handled solely by the city, and was a dismal failure.
- As GLBT Liaison for the City, Tim spoke at a number of GLBT event on behalf of the City Council including the presentation of proclamations.
- Organized the first-ever event for major donors and VIP's for the D.C. Pride Festival.
- Co-Founder of OUT TAKES Dallas – The Annual Lesbian and Gay Film Festival. Now in its 6th year, attracts over 75 volunteers and 5,000 movie-goers.

Tim has a BS in Radio/Television Production from San Diego State University. He moved to Washington D.C. in 1989 and began working for Jack Morton Productions as an account manager and producer before changing career paths and going to law school. He and his life partner, David Sullivan became involved with "Reel Affirmations," Washington D.C.'s Lesbian and Gay Film Festival in 1994, and were Co-chairs in 1995. They moved to Dallas in 1997, and were shocked to find that the nation's eighth largest city lacked its own gay and lesbian film festival, so they proceeded to start one. Tim now is a Regional Consultant for the AARP Dallas Regional Office based in Dallas.
