Mason County

Mason County is located in the Texas Hill Country 100 miles west of Austin. The county seat, Mason, is at the intersection of US 377 and US 87. For a free information packet (including a calendar of events and a list of accommodations, restaurants, and shops), write the Mason Chamber of Commerce, Box 156, Mason 76856; 915/347-5758. Walk-on guides available for bus tours by prior arrangement.

The area code for places listed below is 915. All addresses, unless otherwise noted, are Mason 76856. All sites are wheelchair accessible, unless otherwise noted.

Self-Guided Tours

The Chamber of Commerce, at 108 Ft. McKavitt St., has guides for a walking tour of downtown. They also offer driving guides to the April and May Bluebonnet & Wildflower Country Lanes Tours. Three scenic drives beginning in Mason take you along 120 miles of rural roads.

Sites

The historic **Seaquist House**, 400 Broad St., open during the April Bluebonnet Country Lanes Tours for 90-minute tours on Saturdays at 10 a.m., or anytime by appointment. Admission: \$5 per person. Call 347-5413. Not wheelchair accessible.

A reconstruction of the officer's quarters of **Fort Mason** is at 110 Spruce St. and offers a panoramic view of town. Always open for viewing, with interpretive tours by prior arrangement with the chamber of commerce.

View woodcarvings of noted artist **Gene Zesch** at Commercial Bank, 100 Moody, 347-6324. Hours: Mon-Fri 9-3, Sat 9-noon. See an exhibit on Mason native **Fred Gipson**, author of *Old Yeller*, at the M. Beven Eckert Memorial Library, 410 Post Hill St., 347-5446. Hours: Mon-Wed noon-7, Thu 1-5:30, Fri 9-1:30, Sat 10-noon.

Topaz

Two ranches offer topaz hunting with a daily admission of \$10 per person; you keep what you find. Bring digging tools and dress comfortably. Not wheechair accessible. **Garner Seaquist Ranch** also offers camping for \$5 a day (primitive) or \$10 with hookups. Pay fees and get gate key and directions at Nu-Way Gro., 317 Ft. McKavitt, 347-5713. Write to Seaquist Ranch, Box 35. Closed Oct-Dec for deer season. **Wayne Hofmann Ranch** offers free primitive camping; closed Nov-Dec for deer season. Pay fees and get gate key and directions from Wayne Loeffler, 347-6415. His house is located just west of Mason on Texas 29, a quarter-mile past where Texas 29 and US 377 split; look for the white house on the right.

Call for rates and availablility.

Willow Creek Cafe, 106 Ft. McKavitt, 347-6124, opens Thu-Sat 11-2 and 5-9, Sun 11-2. Cooper's Pit BBQ, 802 US 87 South, 347-6897, opens 10:30-5:30 daily. Upper Willow Creek Store cafe, 7898 Texas 29, Art 76820 (347-0019) is 10 miles east of Mason. Hours: Mon-Wed and Fri-Sat 8-5 (Fri-Sat, 8 a.m.-9 p.m. during deer season). Bat Cave

Approximately 16 miles from Mason on James River Rd. is the **Eckert James River Bat Cave Preserve**; open 6 p.m.-9 p.m. Thur-Sun, mid-May to midOct. Time of bat exodus varies. Admission: free. For details and directions, call

Outdoor Recreation

From Oct-Dec, Mason Co. features some of the top bow and gun **deer hunting** in Texas. The chamber sponsors a **Wild Game Dinner** the second Sat. of
Nov. (Nov. 14, 1998) and also keeps a list of available leases. **Fishing** for bass,

sunfish, and catfish has been a Llano River tradition for generations, although floods in 1997 reduced fish populations. For angling guide service, write to Leonard Wilson, HCR 85, Box 10, Hext 76848; 915/456-6069. After moderate to heavy rainfall, try **canoeing** on the Llano. For rentals and put-in/take-out service, write to the Rock Bottom Canoe Co. (Box 564; 347-6440), located at Antiques and Crafts (beside Hemphill Insurance), 201 Westmoreland.

Long known as a haven for **tennis**, Mason hosts two major public tournaments annually: the four-day **Dr. Pepper Tournament**, beginning the fourth weekend in July (July 23-26, 1998) with junior and adult categories, and the **Over-the-Hill Tournament** (age 35 and older) the second weekend in Oct.
