Also get information Mon-Fri 9-5 at the Shiner Main Street office, 817 N. Ave. E (594-3999), located in the historic **Ehlers Cigar Factory** (not wheelchair accessible). Both the cigar factory and the **William Green Pioneer Home** next door are open for tours: self-guided Mon-Fri 9-5 and docent-guided Fri-Sat and Mon 1-4 p.m.

For group bus tours, the Shiner Economic Development Board, 817 N. Ave. E (594-4343), offers step-on guides (\$2 per person, plus lunch for the guide, with 2 weeks notice).

Welhausen Park is on Ave. E (US 90A) five blocks west of downtown. **Green-Dickson Municipal Park** is 1 mile north of downtown on Ave. B and features limited RV camping with hookups. Call 594-3362 for park info.

Peachtree Emporium, 123 E. 7th St. is available for private events and individual tours (call 594-3183 in advance) and group tours (call 594-4343 in advance).

Kaspar Wire Works (594-3327; www.kwire.com) is on Texas 95 N one mile north of US 90A. It offers free one-hour tours by appointment (3 weeks' notice required for bus tours). Not wheelchair accessible.
