Making Mountain Music — UNT returns to Crested Butte, presents summer music festival

DENTON (UNT), Texas — The University of North Texas College of Music is heading west this summer to present the second MoUNTain Music Institute in Crested Butte, Colo.

For three weeks beginning July 12, UNT's College of Music will conduct classes and present a summer festival of concerts in the mountain city.

"Last year's institute was a great success, so we've expanded the program and are taking off for another three weeks this July," said Will May, associate dean of the college and UNT's Mountain Music Institute coordinator.

"The institute is a great opportunity for our students to be involved in presenting a summer festival, something most of them will be doing as professional performers," he said.

About 110 students and 25 faculty members from the world-famous college will travel to Crested Butte to study and teach. 

TAX ABATEMENT POLICY

The City of Denton has had a joint policy with Denton County and the Denton Independent School District regarding Tax Abatements since 1990. To date, the City has granted only one abatement, which was to United Copper Industries in 1998. The City's current policy will expire in February 2000.

The Denton Chamber and City of Denton will co-sponsor a community-wide consensus workshop on economic development in September, and incentives for attracting and retaining business will certainly be discussed.

With the intent of recommending some sort of philosophical position to the chamber board, the Local Relations Committee will review and discuss the City's existing policy, as well as tax abatements in general at **4 p.m.** Monday, **July 12** at the chamber office.
