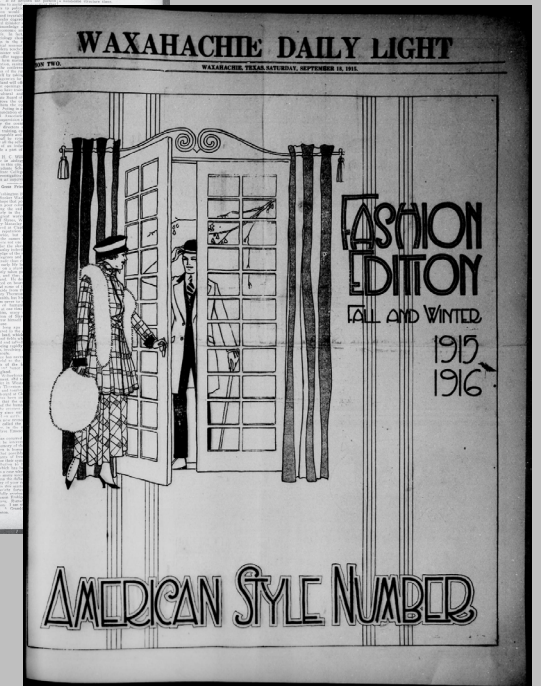

By a special arrangement with the American Melody company of New York, this paper has secured the exclusive right to publish the songs and musical selections of that company in Wood county. We will from time to time publish in the paper the words and music of popular songs and music for instrumental selections, in such form that they can be cut out of the paper and used as sheet music.

The American Melody company is a pioneer concern in the publication of sheet music and was the first to furnish music supplements for the metropolitan dailies containing words and music of popular pieces. This company now furnishes its service to the Chicago American and other leading dailies which issue song supplements.

People who desire the free song service and are not now subscribers to the paper will be furnished with sample copies of this and succeeding issues of the paper containing songs, upon application at the office. It is intended to issue one song and one march or two-step each month, a total of twenty-six pieces of music for the present year.

“By a special arrangement with the American Melody company of New York, this paper has secured the exclusive right to publish the songs and musical selections of that company in Wood county. We will from time to time publish in the paper the words and music of popular songs and music for instrumental selections, **in such form that they can be cut out of the paper and used as sheet music.**”

The American Melody company is a pioneer concern in the publication of sheet music and was the first to furnish music supplements for the metropolitan dailies containing words and music of popular pieces. [...]

It is intended to issue one song and one march or two-step each month, a total of twenty-six pieces of music for the present year.”

- Compositions or arrangements may no longer be extant beyond their publication in newspapers.
- Digital newspaper databases have the potential to rescue this music from obscurity and inspire new scholarship.
- Image-based content, such as notated music in newspapers, is not represented in OCR files associated with the digital image and not directly searchable.

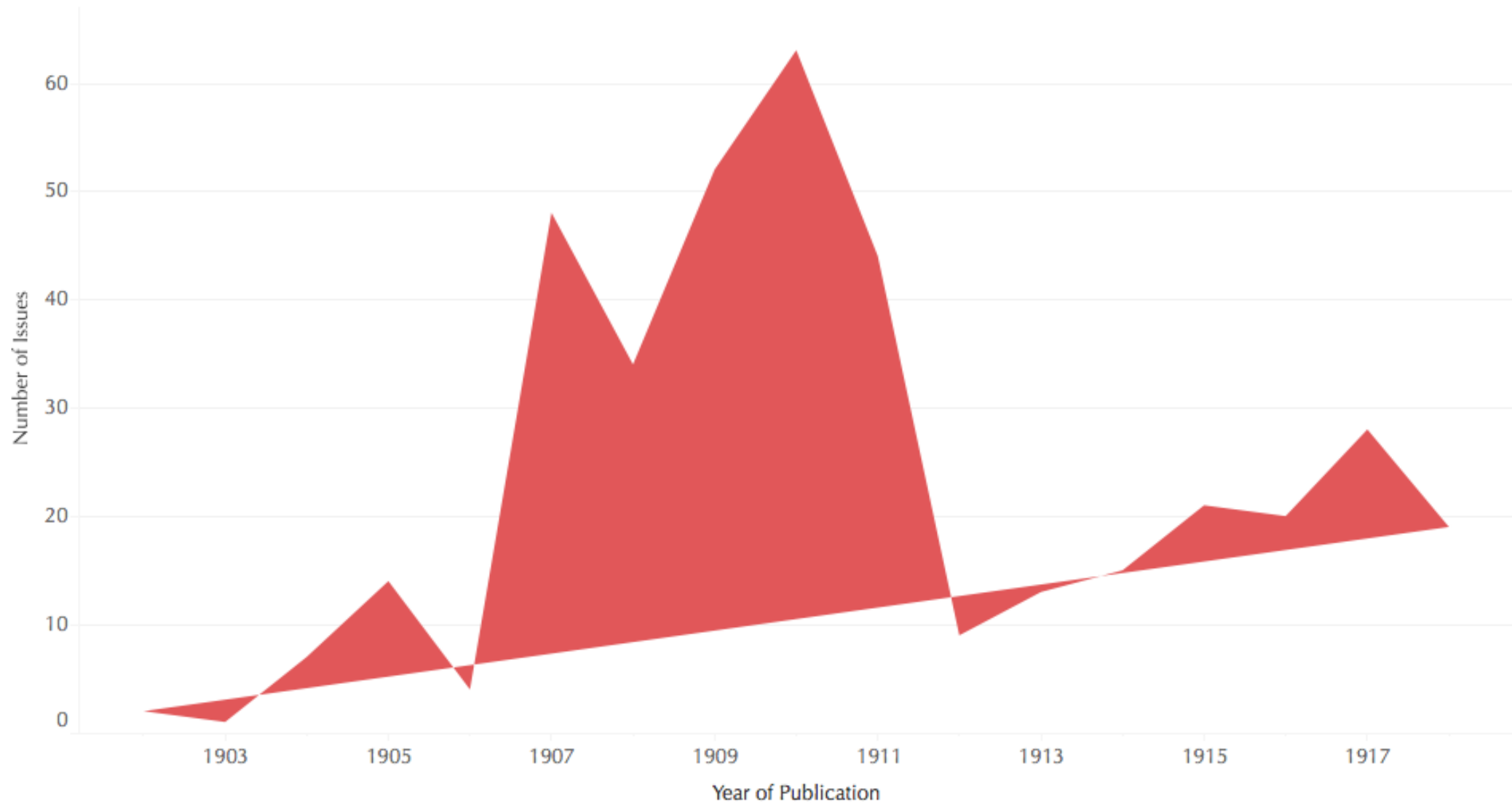

# American Melody Company - Publication Over Time

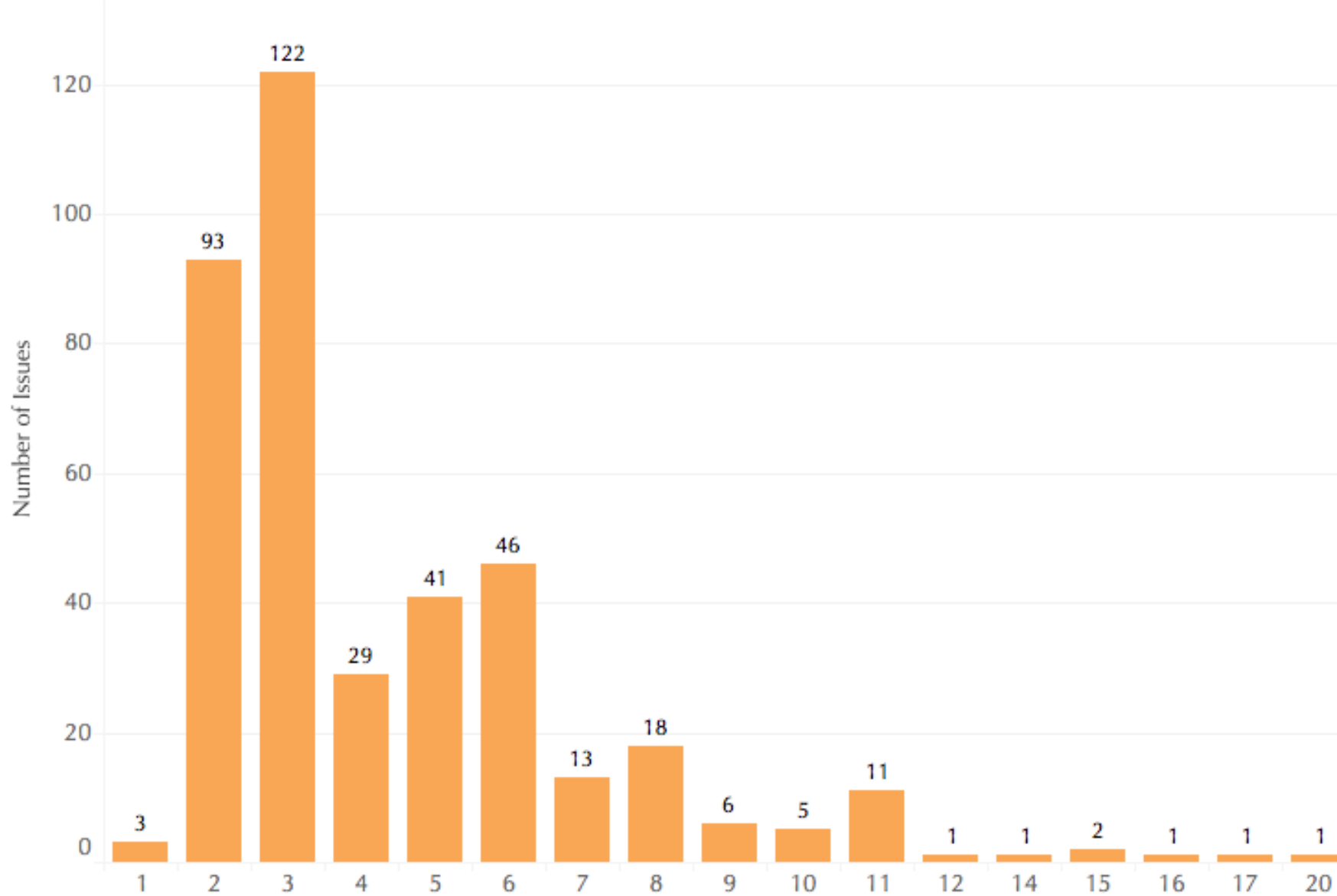


The plot of sum of Number of Records for Items Date Year.



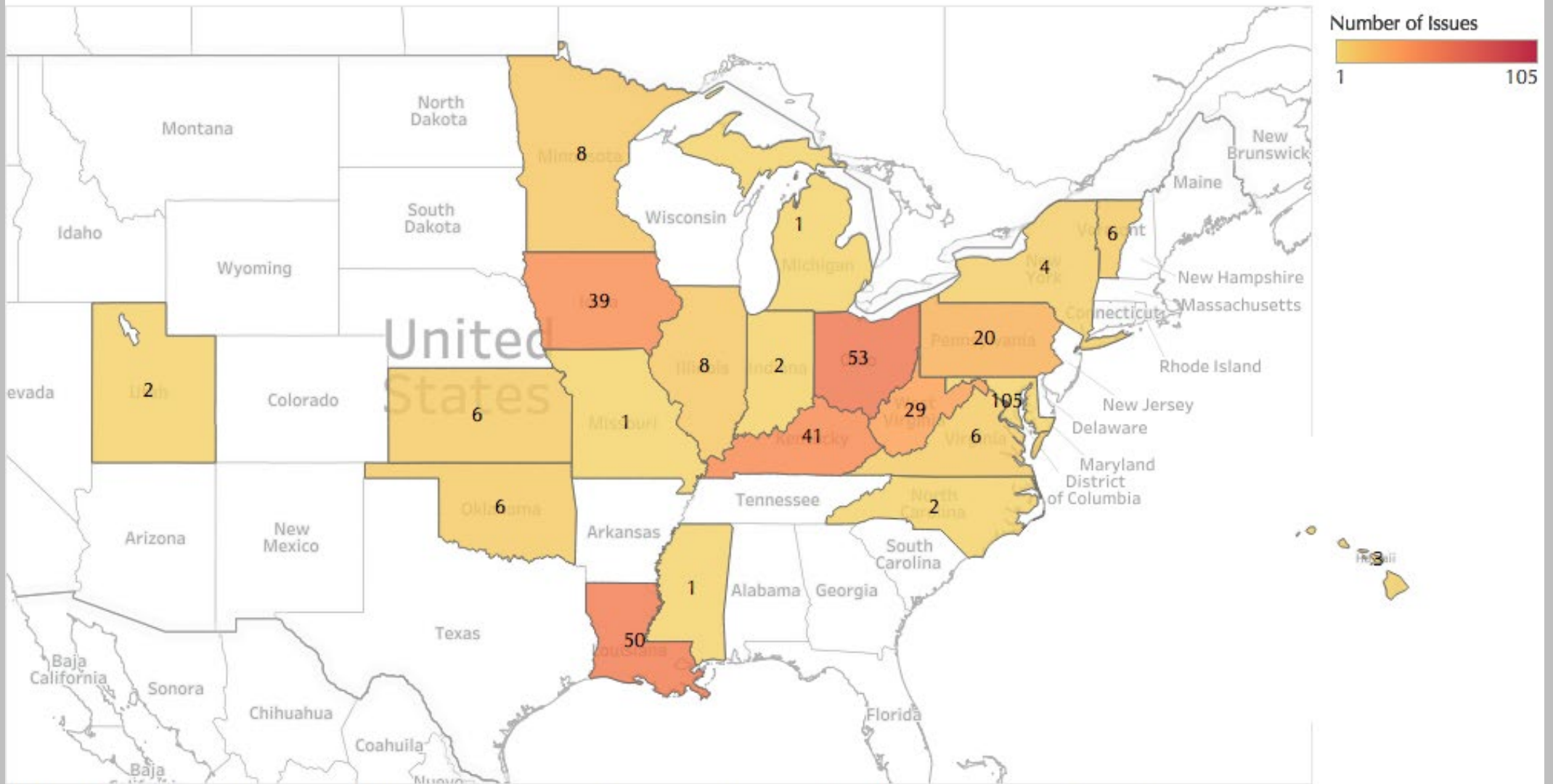

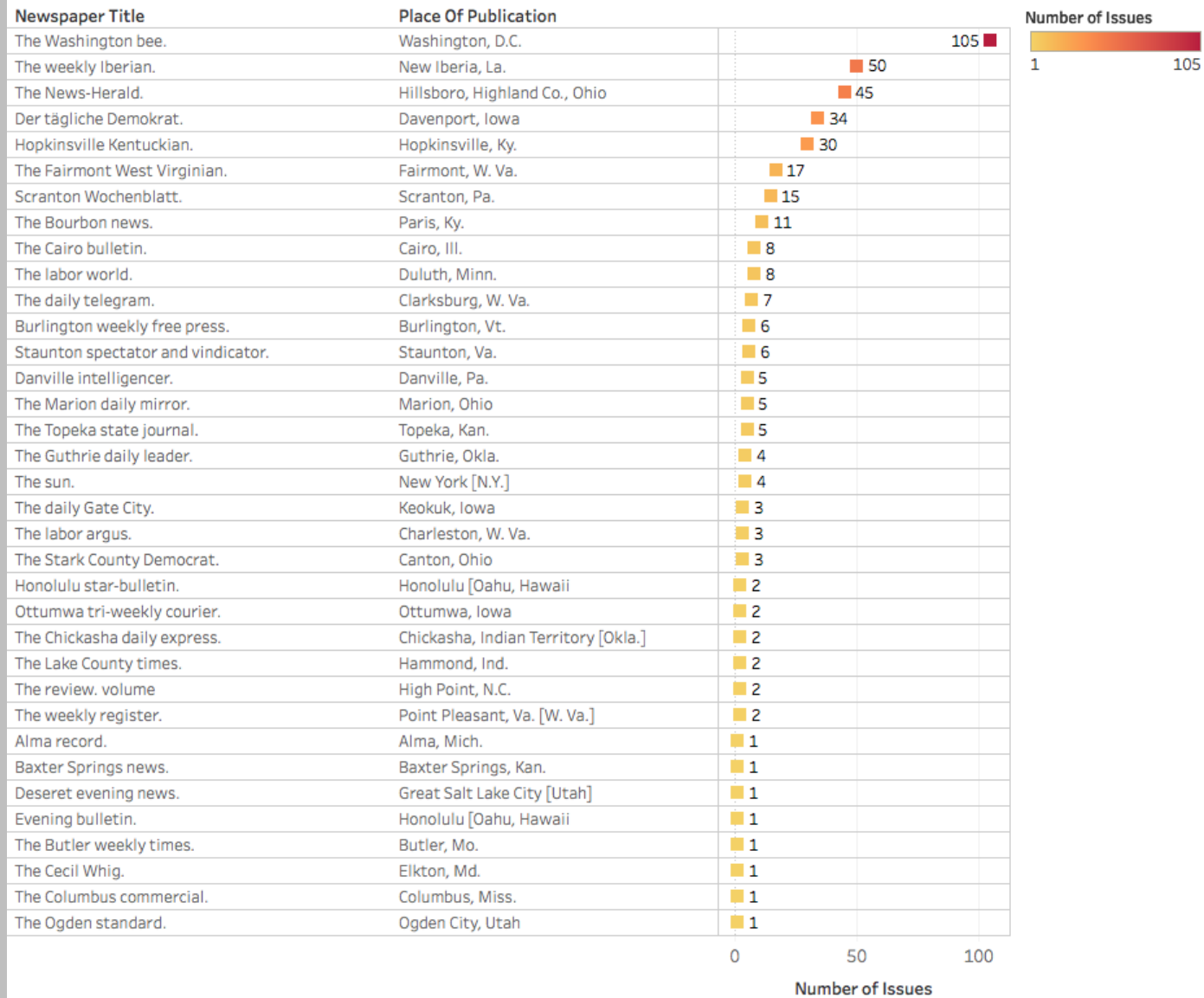
Sum of Number of Records for each Page In Sequence.

Map based on Longitude (generated) and Latitude (generated). Color shows sum of Number of Records. Details are shown for Items State.

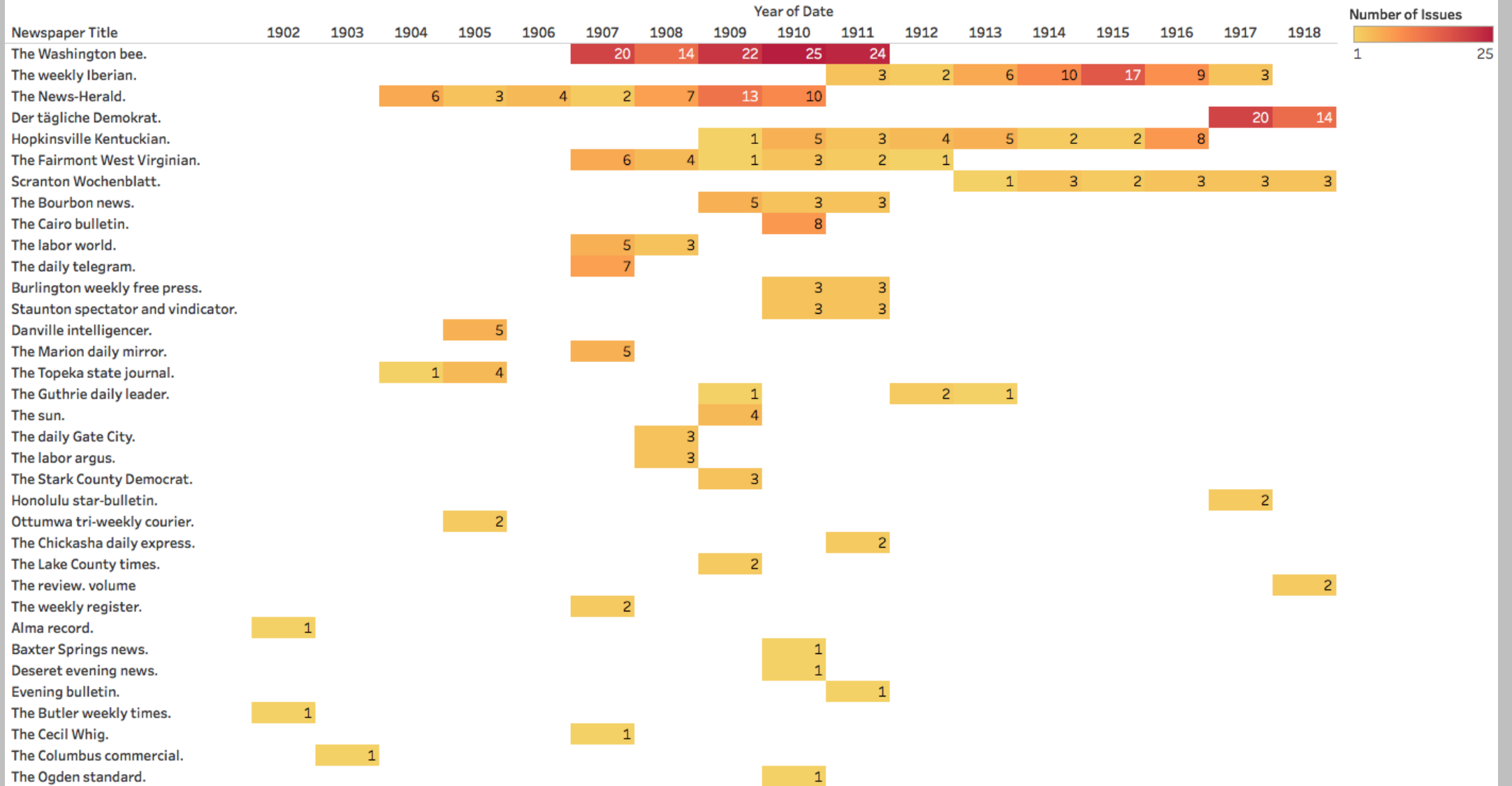
## American Melody Company - Publication By Title

# American Melody Company - Publication By Title and Year




Sum of Number of Records broken down by Date Year vs. Newspaper Title. Color shows sum of Number of Records. The marks are labeled by sum of Number of Records.
