Dear Chairman Principi and BRAC Commissioners:

Enclosed you will find a short CD-ROM presentation outlining one of the unique attributes of the 188th Fighter Wing in Fort Smith, Arkansas.

When Col. Brock Strom, the National Guard Bureau Director of Operations, visited the 188th last fall, he witnessed firsthand how the 188th was conducting training exercises that were critical to AEF deployments for Air National Guard flying units and ground personnel, as well as their Joint Force partners. This is training that can not be duplicated elsewhere. When the 188th appeared on the DOD BRAC list, then Col (Ret) Strom joined the Fort Smith BRAC task force having no ties to the city of Fort Smith, or the state of Arkansas. He did so, because he felt the unique attributes of having fighters at this location were critical to the Future Total Force.

This video attempts to highlight the unique capabilities of the 188th Fighter Wing location and the associated military value of retaining fighters on the ramp in Fort Smith, Arkansas. This additional information will allow you make an informed decision that will impact the Future Total Force in one way or another. At the hearing in San Antonio, time was very limited. I respectfully request each of you to take approximately 10 minutes for this critical piece of the puzzle.

When you weigh the key points previously presented by Col. (Ret) Strom, the Arkansas Congressional Delegation, and former Under Secretary Asa Hutchinson, along with the additional information in this video presentation, we hope you will be compelled from a military value standpoint to reverse the decision to realign the 188th Fighter Wing. We believe the DOD substantially deviated from BRAC criteria, where military value was supposed to be the primary consideration for basing the future force.

Thank you for your service to our country in this process and throughout your career.

  - F16C+ with precision munitions and targeting pod
  - Routinely uses Situational Awareness Data Link
- ▶ Fort Chaffee Training Site
  - Owned & Operated by AR National Guard
  - Restricted Area airspace over entire complex
- ▶ Razorback Range
  - Operated by 188<sup>th</sup> Fighter Wing
  - Embedded within Fort Chaffee ground forces training area

- Special Operations Forces
  - All teams already utilize Fort Chaffee & Razorback Range
  - Dynamic targeting exercises conducted routinely with 188<sup>th</sup>
  - Truly Joint Ops SEALs, AF Special Tactics, Army "Teams"
- ▶ 123<sup>rd</sup> Intelligence Squadron
  - Imagery analysis and target ID experts
  - Operation and setup similar to CAOC intelligence center
  - Staffed by specialists with extensive real world experience


- ▶ 223<sup>rd</sup> Combat Communications Squadron

  - Located in Fayetteville




























#### **Summary**
