BRAC 95 Process


- Key elements of the base realignment & closure selection process
 - PL 101-510
 - OSD force structure plan and criteria
 - Individual Services conduct analysis and select candidates
 - SECDEF recommends specific closures or realignments
 - Independent commission reviews & recommends to President
 - President forwards to Congress or returns to commission
 - Commission returns to President
 - President sends to Congress without changes or process ends
 - Congress may only disapprove entire list by joint resolution

OSD BRAC Selection Criteria

Military Value


- Current & future mission requirements/impact on ops readiness
- Availability & condition of land, facilities and associated airspace at existing and potential receiving locations
- Ability to accommodate contingency mobilization and future force at existing and potential receiving locations
- The cost and manpower implications
- Return on Investment
 - Extent and timing of potential costs and savings including number of years for savings to exceed the costs
- Impacts
 - Economic impact on the communities
 - Ability of both existing and receiving communities infrastructure to support forces mission and personnel
 - Environmental

- Kick off memo
- Internal control plan
- Policy memos (3)
- Data calls
- Joint cross service group leads






OSD BRAC 95 Organization For Analysis





AF Process Relationships BRAC 95






BRAC 95

Base Closure Executive Group

- Established by SECAF to direct, oversee process and ensure compliance with BRAC legislation
- Composed of 13 General Officers and SES
- Members included: AF/RT, DPP, PE, FM, MIQ, LGM, CE, AQX, GCN, MII, XOO, NGB, RE
- Supported by BRAC division
- Conducted analysis in accordance with OSD and AF Internal Control Plans and provided recommendations to SECAF
- Provided support to JCSGs with augmentation from MAJCOM and HQ AF staff

- Collect Data
- Categorize Installations
- Analyze Category Capacity
- Installation Exclusions
- Analyze and Rate Installation Data
- Group Installations Into Tiers
- Identify and Analyze Closure Options
- Coordinate Options with OSD JCSG
- SECAF Selected Candidates

- Calculations based upon:
 - Available Facilities and Ramp
- Methodology
 - Completed and Briefed by Each MAJCOM
 - Utilized 97/4 Force Structure



BRAC 95 Exclusions

- Category Exclusions No Excess in Category
- Geographically Unique, Mission Essential



BRAC 95 Analyze Options

DCN 8477

- Identify candidates for realignment/closure after detailed analysis and tiering
- Evaluate receiver locations (environmental, training, costs)
- Conduct COBRA cost analysis
- Coordinate options with OSD
- SECAF selects realignment/closure candidates



BRAC 95 Lessons Learned

AF broad lessons

- Obtain SECAF/CSAF vision at beginning of process
- Consider allowing AFAA to attend SECAF decision meetings
- Allow AFAA to attend BCEG meetings
- Expand BCEG minutes to contain detailed voting results

Audit lessons

- SECAF more fully document all analyses and decision (GAO Report April 95)
 - Specific closure option meetings of BCEG and SECAF not documented
 - Cumulative rating for each base was not calculated






OSD Organizational Structure





AF BRAC Organization






CORONA SOUTH RESULTS
