## Immokalee and Collier County: an economic and demographic overview

Collier County is a study in contrasts. Like most of south Florida, the county is growing at a phenomenal clip, adding about 45,000 permanent residents between 1995 and 2000. On the western edge, the City of Naples boasts one of the higher per capita incomes in the nation and is rated by *Money Magazine* as one of the best small places to live in America (see Table 1). By contrast, Immokalee—located in the central part of the county—is growing at a slower pace and records per capita incomes less than half that of Naples. Whereas Naples is an overwhelmingly Anglo community, Immokalee is predominantly Hispanic.

Contrasts also abound when comparing the economic bases of the two communities. The Naples economy is dominated by tourism, recreation, and retirement-related services. Retail employment, health care, business services, and construction have also posted strong job gains in recent years. In contrast, Immokalee's economy is centered on seasonal agriculture. Whereas agriculture makes up only 2.5 percent of Florida's total employment, it accounts for more than 12 percent in Collier County with most of the jobs concentrated in and around Immokalee. Immokalee residents also fill many of the lower-paid service jobs in Naples and Marco Island.

In recent years, efforts have been taken to diversify Immokalee's economy. The city has been designated a Federal Enterprise Community, and a broad range of state and local fiscal incentives are available for new and relocating businesses. But the only new "export-based" industry of note in Immokalee is the Seminole Indian Casino that employs 300 people and attracts about 20,000 visitors per month on average. And Immokalee's unemployment rate hovers near 10 percent.

Does a regional raceway make economic sense in Immokalee?

Last year, drag racing began on an idle runway of the Immokalee Regional Airport. The 1/8-mile temporary drag strip has drawn crowds of more than 5,000 people and 300 dragsters from all over South Florida. It is reported that on weekends when the track is operational, the only hotel in Immokalee is completely booked. In view of the overwhelming success of this enterprise, construction of a multi-purpose motorsports park is being considered that would include three major racing facilities: a 4/10 mile oval track, a two-mile road course, and a 1/4 mile drag strip. Other racing facilities, such as motocross and BMX dirt tracks, could be added down the road at the proposed Immokalee Motorsports Park (IMP).

Will a larger facility work in Immokalee? Most definitely, yes. Motorcar racing is the nation's most popular and fastest-growing spectator sport, and its appeal cuts across socioeconomic lines. What's more, the sport's strongest draw is in the southeastern U.S. NASCAR, IHRA, and other sanctioning organizations have a major presence in the Southeast, especially Florida. In fact, Florida currently boasts 23 racetracks, including the Immokalee facility (see appendix A). But with the exception of Immokalee, none of these venues is located in southwestern Florida. The Immokalee track is within two

hours of more than eight million potential spectators, virtually ensuring a strong draw for racing events.

Racing organizations have already expressed interest in utilizing the Immokalee Motorsports Park once it's developed. Sanctioning letters have been submitted by the International Hot Rod Association (IHRA), the Southern Pro Truck Series, United Speed Alliance Racing, the Florida Dwarf Car Federation, 911 Racing, and the Southern Automobile Racing Association.

A raceway also makes sense in the context of plans to expand the Seminole Casino, the principal magnet currently drawing people—and their money—from outside the region. At present, about 20,000 gamblers visit the Seminole Casino monthly, mainly on day trips. Plans are underway to upgrade and expand the existing facility in hopes of attracting more “high rollers,” including some who will spend the night. A developer has proposed spending \$12 million to overhaul the existing casino and add a 47,000 square foot entertainment pavilion that would seat between 1,500 and 3,000 patrons. With a venue that size, the casino would be able to attract big-time entertainment and sports events that cannot currently be accommodated in Collier County. In addition, the tribe has decided to build an 80 to 150 room hotel off Highway 29 at an estimated cost of \$7 million. Importantly, the hotel will be constructed in close proximity to the motorsports facility. These investments and events, in turn, will bring additional jobs and income to Immokalee residents.

In short, the new raceway and casino will complement each other, making Immokalee a true tourist destination while providing more stable local employment opportunities. The new facilities will also offer diversions to the nearly 20,000 Swamp

Buggy fans who come to Immokalee each year as well as to those attending the annual Great Chili Cookoff. The proposed venues will also offer new recreational and entertainment amenities to Immokalee area residents who currently have very limited options except for spring baseball training, a minor league baseball team and a minor league hockey team—all at a considerable distance from Immokalee.

### The economic impacts of the proposed Immokalee Regional Raceway

In what follows, we estimate the total economic impacts that would attend construction and operation of the proposed ¼ mile drag strip, oval track, and road course. These estimates are based on projected operating budgets for the tracks and estimated spending by track visitors using the IMPLAN<sup>1</sup> input/output model for Collier County. Even though the model does not directly estimate impacts at the city level, a large portion of the modeled spending will likely occur in the local economy. The IMPLAN model provides estimates of direct, indirect, and induced impacts.

Direct economic impacts represent direct spending for goods and services by the track. For example, the track will purchase electricity, advertising services, sanitary services (porta johns), insurance, and a host of other items. Indirect impacts occur when the racetrack's vendors spend money in the local economy to support their business operations, such as the sanitary service company buying office supplies from a local retailer. Finally, induced impacts are those that result from employees spending a portion of their earnings in the area for groceries, household goods, and other durable and non-durable goods.

Track operations alone will have relatively small impacts on the local economy. Most employment at the track will be part-time, temporary jobs supporting operations during special events. However, spending by visitors for lodging, food, souvenirs, and other retail goods, both at the track and outside the track, will provide a substantial boost to the local economy. Visitor spending includes concession spending during local racing events and spending by local and out-of-area spectators and racing teams at special events. Estimates of visitor spending during special events are based on visitor surveys reported by the International Hot-Rod Association and the experience of other racing venues. Visitor spending estimates for local events are authors' estimates based on analyses we have performed on other entertainment venues.

Typically, spending by track visitors from the local area would not be counted as new economic activity. Spending by an Immokalee resident at the track is usually "substitute spending," which would have occurred in the local economy with or without the presence of the racetrack. However, given the limited entertainment options for local residents, we feel that spending by local residents at the racetrack will recapture monies that currently flow out of the local market.

#### *Impacts from construction*

Construction outlays for the oval track, expanded drag strip, and road course are estimated to be about \$9.5 over a five year period. This activity will generate \$15 million in total area economic activity and support 164 jobs paying more than \$5.3 million in wages and salaries over the five-year period.

*Economic impacts from new employment*

Estimates of the economic impacts of direct track operations are based on projected admissions revenues for the combined facilities. When all three racing venues are completed, the track will support between 5 and 10 full time jobs. However, the largest employment impact from track operations will be the hundreds of part-time concessionaires, ticket takers, ushers, clean up crews, maintenance engineers, security personnel, and other jobs filled during racing events. These part-time positions will equate to an estimated 73 full-time-equivalent (FTE) jobs. Combined, these new full and part time jobs will pay over \$1.6 million in direct earnings. Spending by track employees (the induced effect) will support an additional 41 jobs in the area economy paying about \$1.2 million in earnings. In addition, track operations will support an additional 14 jobs in the area economy with track vendors adding \$454,000 to total area earnings (the indirect effect). In total, operations at the track will boost economic activity in Collier County by \$10.1 million, support 138 FTE jobs, and increase earned income by nearly

\$3.3 million (see Table 3). Appendix B provides a detailed listing of Collier County industries that are expected to benefit from this new economic activity.

*Visitor spending impacts of the proposed motorsports park*

The largest impacts on the Immokalee economy will result from local spending by track visitors when the racing complex is fully developed. Developers of the Immokalee facility have projected that local and major racing events at the drag strip will entertain about 187,000 visitors per year, while the oval track and road course will attract about 66,000 and 27,000 attendees per year, respectively. We estimate that visitors to the Immokalee racing complex will spend \$12.7 million for lodging, about \$13.6 million at eating and drinking establishments, and \$1.9 million on miscellaneous retail goods such as souvenirs, supplies, and sundries.<sup>2</sup> In total, visitor spending will reach \$28.2 million per year at projected attendance levels. This spending will generate \$46.5 million in economic activity in the area and support about 780 direct, indirect, and induced jobs

paying over \$17.5 million in annual earnings. Table 4, below, summarizes these impacts while Appendix C provides a detailed breakdown by industry.

In the early stages of the racing complex development, a significant portion of spending by visitors away from the track for food and lodging may occur outside the immediate Immokalee area. However, as entertainment and tourism attraction synergies develop between the racetrack and the casino, new restaurants and hotels will likely open creating the opportunity for local entrepreneurs to capture an increasing share of the area economic impacts. Moreover, these estimates may actually understate the total potential economic impacts the Immokalee area will enjoy from the proposed raceway.

*Total recurring economic impacts from the racetrack*

When the Immokalee racing complex is fully developed, total recurring impacts of racetrack operations and visitor spending will generate \$56.6 million in economic activity in Collier County, much of which can be captured in the local economy with additional lodging and eating establishments. This activity will support more than 900 direct, indirect, and induced jobs paying almost \$20.8 million in annual earnings.

Other tangible impacts

Based on the experience of other racing facilities in the Southeast, a number of related economic impacts can be anticipated when the Immokalee Motorsports Park (IMP) is built out.

*Procurement*

Racetracks, like other businesses, are consumers of goods and services. In conducting its operations, the IMP will be purchasing durables, consumables, financial services, maintenance contracts, and utility services from local areas businesses. The spending of these procurement dollars will ripple through the region in much the same fashion as spectator dollars, creating jobs and tax revenues in the process. Though no direct procurement estimates for the IMP are currently available, a reasonable estimate is that several million procurement dollars will flow through the local economy annually once the IMP is built out.

*Spin-off industries*

Many raceways of the scale proposed for the Immokalee facility serve as a magnet for new businesses that specialize in aftermarket parts for cars, developers of auto racing components, driving schools, and other related businesses. Each of these creates

jobs in the local economy and helps to enhance market awareness of the community. For example, the Sebring International Raceway is one of the busiest test sites for Indy cars, sports cars and tires. Several driving schools and car clubs are also based at the Sebring Raceway. Similar club and driving school activities can be expected at the Immokalee track, including moto-cross, Porsche Club, off-road vehicle races and testing, and perhaps a police vehicle test track.

Moreover, there is tremendous potential to examine joint marketing and event planning opportunities with the Seminole casino and proposed new hotel. For example, special event race attendees will have the opportunity to extend their stay in the area by visiting the casino and its varied entertainment options. Conversely, the racetrack will be able to more effectively market local as well as special racing events by attracting the attention of casino patrons.

*Real estate development and fiscal impacts*

Collier County has been one of the fastest-growing counties in Florida for a number of years, though the area around Immokalee has grown at a slower pace. Given its location in the comparatively undeveloped and isolated part of the county, the IMP is ideally situated and should prove to be a catalyst for future growth. Commercial and industrial development is greatly needed in Immokalee, and the spin-off industries likely to locate on or around the raceway can help broaden the tax base and hold down future property taxes for area homeowners and businesses while generating new revenues for education and other public services.

This has certainly been the case around the Atlanta, Georgia and Charlotte, North Carolina NASCAR tracks. Between 1991 and 1995, taxable property values in Henry

County (GA), where the NASCAR track is located, increased 53 percent while they jumped 22 percent in Cabarrus County (NC), site of the Charlotte Speedway. During that same period, sales tax collections increased 67 percent in Henry County and 75 percent in Cabarrus County. This is not to suggest that the impacts of the proposed IMP will be of the same magnitude or that the NASCAR tracks have been the only factors accounting for the dramatic tax revenue gains in Henry and Cabarrus counties. But in view of the ancillary developments that can be anticipated once the IMP is fully operational, both the City of Immokalee and Collier County can anticipate significant expansions of their local tax bases—currently \$171,686,418 in the city and \$27,740,053,849 in the county. Each one percent gain in the city’s property tax base adds about \$2,700 to local coffers at the current millage rate while a one percent gain in the county’s property tax base brings in an additional \$329,000 of revenue. Collier County cities will also see an increase in tourist development tax collections as a result of developments at and around the IMP.

*Business sponsorships and endorsements*

At present, 70 local area businesses are advertising at the Immokalee drag strip. Fifty-two of them are using signage as their advertising medium. But as the IMP evolves, national firms can be expected to step up to the table with both advertising and sponsorship. Many companies, both auto and non-auto related, are involved with motorcar racing. Some companies “underwrite” racing teams, while others provide the purses for races. Not only do sponsorships bring new money to the region, but they can also help market Immokalee to the rest of the racing community across the U.S.

Without question, community support for the new facility is quite strong, as evidenced by several dozen testimonials from local and regional businesses. These

testimonials should translate into additional advertising and business activity once the new track is up and running.

*The Immokalee Enterprise Zone (EZ) and Foreign Entrepreneurial Investment Zone (FEIZ)*

The Immokalee Regional Airport's industrial park includes a foreign trade zone, a foreign entrepreneurial investment zone, and a manufacturing incubator facility. Eligible businesses receive corporate and sales/use tax credits or refunds for certain types of investment in the EZ, while foreign business owners seeking permanent U.S. residency have a lower investment requirement if they locate in the FEIZ. These incentive programs may help attract certain auto-related businesses to Immokalee in conjunction with the construction and operations of the planned motorsports park.

*Media coverage*

Motorcar racing is receiving more and more newspaper, magazine, and television coverage. When reporters, commentators, photographers, and television crews come to town, their activities have three types of economic impacts. First, media people spend money on hotels, restaurants, car rentals, and the like. Second, out-of-town media organizations will often hire local workers and equipment. Third, and perhaps most important, media coverage in newspapers, magazines, and television can give Immokalee the type of broad exposure money can't buy.

Conclusion

Development of the proposed Immokalee Motorsports Park will not be a panacea for the region's economic problems. But it will provide new jobs and income for some

area residents while attracting more out-of-region dollars to Immokalee. If the Seminole Indian Casino goes ahead with its expansion and new hotel, the three projects together would bring major economic benefits to the region.

A recent study done by the authors on the feasibility and economic impacts of two proposed casinos and hotels in the Dallas-Fort Worth area projected more than 12 million annual casino visits and \$1.4 billion of casino revenue.<sup>3</sup> Such spending would generate several thousand new jobs and \$47 million in local tax receipts. This is not to suggest that Collier County would realize the exact same outcome, but coincidentally both DFW and Immokalee can draw on a market of eight million within a two-hour drive.

In short, these two tourist/entertainment venues, along with a new hotel, can bring a huge amount of new business to the Immokalee area while providing new diversions and family entertainment for residents across south Florida.
