Fostering Partnerships between Federal Agencies and Local Utilities

The Federal Utility Partnership Working Group (FUPWG) brings together Federal agencies and their serving utilities to identify, develop, and successfully implement cost-effective energy efficiency, water efficiency, and renewable energy projects at Federal sites nationwide. The use of utility energy services contracts (UESCs) to implement these projects is a key emphasis of FUPWG. The working group is committed to helping Federal agencies reduce the energy-related cost of fulfilling their missions.

Mission

FUPWG was established in 1994 by the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) Federal Energy Management Program (FEMP) with a mission to strengthen relationships and investments between Federal agencies, public utilities, and other energy-related organizations.

Activities and Services

FUPWG provides working group members with training, education, and networking opportunities. Members include public utilities, their Federal utility customers, and other energy-related organizations. Issues addressed include the identification, design, and implementation of cost-effective energy efficiency, water conservation and renewable energy projects. FUPWG also provides members with objective educational and technical assistance services. FUPWG meets twice a year to:

- Exchange information on recent utility incentive program, success stories, and best management practices.
- Provide a forum for sharing lessons learned.
- Discuss current Federal energy management programs and products.
- Collaborate on issues and obstacles inhibiting successful energy projects.

Program Objectives

FUPWG seeks to enhance Federal outreach, training, and educational activities on current issues through a number of objectives. These objectives include:

- Providing training on Federal procurement practices, energy efficiency measures, and renewable energy technologies.
- Increasing awareness of utility service offerings.
- Overcoming barriers to project implementation.
- Identifying opportunities for public utilities to achieve mandated energy savings at Federal sites more effectively.
- Developing guidance documents related to implementing cost-effective energy management programs at Federal facilities.
- Clarifying how to meet legislative and regulatory requirements impacting the Federal acquisition of utility services.
- Documenting and reporting utility-related projects successfully implemented at Federal sites.
- Preparing agencies to respond effectively to future electric utility industry changes.
