Name	Label	Definition
agent-qualifiers	Creator/Contributor Role	Creator/Contributor role indicates the relationship of that person or corporate body to the resource being described. N.B. Except where specified in the "Notes", Creator/Contributor roles and definitions for the roles come from the Library of Congress's MARC Code Lists for Relators, Sources, Description Conventions: http://www.loc.gov/marc/relators/index.html .
agent-type	Creator Type	Agent or creator type categorizes whether the creator name belongs to an individual, an organization, an event, or a software.
citationQualifiers	Citation Qualifiers	Qualifiers for the UNTL Citation metadata field.
collections	Collection	The term collection means that the resource is described as a group; its parts may also be separately described and navigated. Collection name refers to a larger group of resources with a unique collective title to which the resource being described belongs. We added a filed "system" for each collection term with a value of either "pth" for the Portal to Texas History, or "dc" for UNT Digital Collections. coverage-eras	Coverage Time Period	Coverage time periods refer to time periods that are covered and/or discussed in the intellectual content of the resource, not the creation (publication) date.
coverage-qualifiers	Coverage Type	Coverage is the extent or scope of the content of the resource. It will typically include spatial location (a place name or geographic coordinates) and a temporal period (a period label, date, or date range).
date-qualifiers	Date	Dates associated with events in the life cycle of the resource.
degree-information	Degree Information	Degree information provides detail information associated with the work as it appears within the work.

BACKGROUND: The Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) of the U.S. Gulf of Mexico (GOM) is one of the most highly developed and mature basins in the world. Over the last 50 years, the oil and gas industry has installed over 15,000 structures and 33,000 miles of interconnecting pipelines in the gulf waters. Today, there are about 4,000 active structures installed in federal water ranging from less than 10 feet to over 7,000 feet. Structures need to be constructed, delivered, installed, and equipped prior to production, operated and serviced during production, and then eventually decommissioned and removed after production. Each of these activities has both a direct and indirect impact on the communities in which the service facilities and manufacturing operations are located, and hence induce a "spillover" effect on the economic growth of regions which serve the development. An entire industry has been built in the GOM around installing production equipment and structures, servicing those structures (maintenance, repair, supply), and then removing the structures when production ceases.
