A Note to Users

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The citations include books, government publications, and some pamphlets and microfilms and are divided into subject areas. When looking for books on a particular topic, check all subject headings which are even remotely related to the topic. For instance, when looking for books on the impact multinational corporations have on the Third World, it would be a good idea to check listings under relevant geographical headings and all listings under the subject Political Economics, as well as those under the specific heading

The Third World. Many books under these other headings will contain extensive information on developing countries from the particular perspective which the title indicates. Also, many books indicate content which would qualify them for more than one area; however, to avoid repetition these have been cited only once.

If you do not find a subject heading for your topic, check the citations under "Other miscellaneous". The entries here deal with specific topics which could not be categorized under broad terms, such as, The Deciding Factors in the Choice of a Subsidiary Sales Company as the Channel for Exports by Erik Hornell and Jan-Erik Vahlne. The subject heading General has citations which indicate content of a more general nature or which cover a broad range of topics. If you are not successful in obtaining sufficient information on your particular topic, it might be helpful to locate several of the books listed under this heading and to check the table of contents. For background information or information needed to give the reader familiarity with the topic of multinational corporations, the "General" heading would be best.

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
